To Mrs. Norwood and her family,



After serving 28+ years in the commonwealth of Pennsylvania state penitentiary system, I remain hopeful that I will one day be able to continue making positive contributions both inside and outside the state prison system.

It is therefore out of respect, concern, and consideration for your family that I seek your forgiveness and support of my efforts to seek commutation of my life sentence.
